**GOODBYE YELLOW CARDS, HELLO RED FRIENDSHIP PADS!** Starting today, we will be returning to a former practice of using red folders with a sign in sheet (one folder at each pew). Those who have joined us in worship before 2020 will find this a familiar ritual. For those new to us in recent years, the form should be easy to use. We hope that all will take a moment to sign the pad, then pass it on to the neighbor in your pew. Most importantly – please take a moment to see who is seated nearby. As Jody noted last week, Christians are in the hospitality business! Thank you to all who have cooperated with our COVID – coping yellow cards for recording members and friends in worship.

**BACKGROUND ON WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY:** World Communion Sunday (originally called World Wide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor. 1933 was the darkest year of the Great Depression. The storm clouds of Nazism and Fascism hovered all over Europe and threatened the entire world. As a faith response to these concerns, a group of leaders at Shadyside Presbyterian Church sought to do something both real and symbolic to proclaim that God is God indeed, in spite of politics, economics and future shock. The proposal of World Communion Sunday was their attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—in which everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected one with another. Dr. Kerr remembers why they wanted to lift up the unity of the church: “It was during the Second World War that the World Community Sunday caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. World Wide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ.”

**FLAGS FOR WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY:** The flags, representing 26 countries, are being used during the services today to celebrate World Communion Sunday. They were made in 1979 by Frances Royston, who was Chair of the Worship Ministry then, and have been used annually since.

**PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS OFFERING:** Each year on World Communion Sunday, we participate in the PC(USA)’s Peace and Global Witness Offering. Gifts received for this special offering are used to support the denomination’s Presbyterian Peacemaking Program as well as local peace-making efforts in our community. This year the local portion of our offering will go to support the Little Rock Race and Faith Summit hosted by the Little Rock Congregations Study and UA Little Rock. The goal of this summit is to help equip faith leaders and congregations in Little Rock for the work of racial justice and reconciliation. Please give generously to support the work of peacemakers in our community and world.

**UPDATE FROM YOUR PASTOR NOMINATING COMMITTEE:** Great news from the PNC! The MIF has been approved by the Session and the Presbytery's Committee on Ministry. Now the process is to post the MIF to the CLC, the Church Leadership Connection site for prospective candidates. We anticipate getting our first applicants in October. One way you can help - if you have connections with other Presbyterian pastors or folks in the pastor community, let them know we're looking. And let us know as well! If you visit a church in your travels and the pastor knocks your socks off, we'd love to have those recommendations. Continue to pray for us as we continue this search.


