


### **Welcome back, Randy!**



Join us Feb. 15 at 3:00 p.m. in person in Second Hall (Zoom by request only). Our group Second Readers is regathering with a new purpose: once we met to re-read familiar books from high school and secondary education; now we meet to read

books that may provoke and encourage us to deeper thought about our current world. Leaders will still rise from among us to share a book that they found personally impactful, and we encourage readers – men and women, younger and older – to join us for an hour every third Wednesday at 3:00 pm (preferably in-person) to dialog about books, reading, and the impact it makes on our lives.

Our first book will be led by Nancy Coleman, *Silent Spring Revolution* by David Brinkley. "Rachel Carson's book *Silent Spring*, published in 1962, depicted how detrimental DDT was to living creatures. The exposé launched an ecological revolution. In intimate detail, Brinkley extrapolates on such epic events as the Donora (Pennsylvania) smog incident, JFK's Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, Great Lakes preservation, the Santa Barbara oil spill, and the first Earth Day." #### **Transitions as Ministry** - January 15, 22, 29

#### **LUKE: Jesus and the Outcasts** by Adam Hamilton - February 26 - April 9

Join us for a new Lenten series by acclaimed pastor and author Adam Hamilton that explores the life of Jesus as told in the Gospel of Luke. Throughout Jesus’ ministry we find stories of his relationships with ordinary, flawed, and unexpected people. He met, dined, and traveled with people who were not perfect. Many were struggling, some were outsiders or even outlaws. Whoever they were, from those he healed to the outlaws at his crucifixion, Jesus brought the good news of God’s kingdom to those who needed to hear it. As we study we will see Jesus’ concern for those who were considered unimportant, and hear a hopeful word for our lives today.

Rev. Dr. Williamson shares biblical views and passages concerning economic justice and what these passages call the church to do today in an engaging lecture and conversation format.
