### A Note from Ben

To the family and friends of Second Presbyterian Church!

"Can I have the opportunity to potentially disrupt your life?"

That was the title of an email I received in my inbox. I clicked to open it because it was a bold statement to make, and boldness should be rewarded. Much to my dismay, I quickly realized the email sender was a local businessperson trying to get me to change insurance carriers. I didn't change carriers, but I've not forgotten that email title and the more I think about it, I believe it's because of one reason.

That's Jesus' opening line to each of us, every day.

He is constantly asking us, "Can I have the opportunity to potentially disrupt your life?" And what we find with Christ's question is that it is an entry point into our lives so he might have the opportunity to disrupt how we think, act, believe, work, function, worship, educate, and are in relationships with each other and God. Here's what's beautiful about Christ – because He is the God of grace, he asks this question without coercion because he isn't selling us anything we need to buy. He simply wants the opportunity to give you something that will disrupt your life. And that *thing* is the good news of the gospel.

Here's the thing about disruptions – sometimes they can be good!

In many ways my arrival will be a disruption to your lives — and I pray that is a good thing! My very presence will be a disruption to the staff, congregation, and larger Little Rock community as I'm someone new and will do things a little (or a lot!) differently than previous pastors and leaders. My constant prayer in this season of transition is that my arrival is a good disruption that'll make us all consider what God is doing and how God sees our future unfolding together.

When I first join you in worship on Sunday, September 10, I want to delve into a preaching series on the Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7. In that sermon, Christ seeks to disrupt our lives with grace, love, and hope. As we'll find in that magnificent sermon, Jesus showcases who God is and how God seeks to enter our lives with the good news of the gospel that disrupts how we think about God, ourselves, faith, and the world around us.

I'm grateful to God for this call to be your next pastor and when you read this, my family and I will be settling into life in Little Rock. What I want you to know is that there is much to celebrate in these coming weeks and months and I'm eager to join with you in doing the ministry to which God's called each of us to engage. My invitation to you is that as you explore this brochure of offerings for the fall, would you prayerfully consider where God might be seeking to disrupt your life?

Maybe God is calling you to join a new small group or Sunday school class; maybe God is nudging you to consider working with the children's or youth ministries; or maybe God is sending notice to you to pay attention to the many mission and outreach opportunities that Second engages with; or maybe God's calling you to recommit to a daily prayer life and to join with us in worship each Sunday morning.

Whatever it is, know that God is showing up in your life each day seeking to disrupt you with a simply profound question, "Can I have the opportunity to potentially disrupt your life?"

What a question to be asked – especially by our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ! May you know that I'll be praying for you all in these coming weeks and am excited to be joining with you in the ministry of Second Presbyterian soon.
