From the Pastor's Desk:

One of our favorite books to read to our children when they were younger was, *The Hello, Goodbye Window,* by Norton Juster. It is the story of a girl who goes to see her grandparents often and the joy of walking by the window that gives this book its name – the Hello, Goodbye Window. Each time she arrives at her grandparent's house, she passed by the Hello, Goodbye Window and her grandparents greet her with eager smiles, delighting in her presence and the joy of welcoming her to their home; similarly, when she leaves their house, they watch her walk by, sending her off with kisses and love as she passes the window.

I've been thinking about that book for three reasons. First, I like to think that's the way God acts when we walk toward any window because God delights in our presence and is elated to welcome us home; similarly, God is equally joyful when we leave a place to go out into the world to be God's people.

Additionally, I like to think that's how people feel when they come to Second Pres. for worship or a committee meeting or a mid-week Bible study or PW meeting or choir practice or any other time they come to this wonderful church.



Take a minute to consider that many of our entrances have quite a few windows (a delightful aspect of our church's architecture). This is an opportunity, friends. It gives us the ability to see who is coming our way so we might greet them with joy, as if they are coming home! As you know, there is nothing like being greeted with joy because it changes you, it makes you feel special and like you matter, it reminds you that someone cares.

Lastly, you've noticed that we been saying hello and goodbye to staff, welcoming new members, and saying goodbye to beloved friends and members who've died and joined the great cloud of witnesses. These are opportunities to welcome and send our people out into the world or to the heavenly realm, which are integral parts of God's call upon our lives.

I share all of this about windows because they remind me that God is doing something at Second Pres. and I'm overjoyed. We are growing – both numerically and in the depth of our faith and people want to join us on this journey. This means we have done great things; it also means we have work to do.

To end, I want to offer two invitations – to continue to greet one another with the love and joy of God every time you are at Second and, secondly, to wear your nametag. Here's why these things matter. To commit to greeting one another with the love of God is to acknowledge that such a greeting is transformative – both the receiver and giver. Furthermore, wearing your nametag gives others the chance to learn who we are so they might greet us in a similar manner – and helps you remember a name and face that you may have forgotten!

God is doing great things here at Second Pres., friends. Just look at the windows!

Now, I bet you'll never look at the many windows at Second in the same way again, will you?! May they be a reminder of God's gracious and loving welcome to each of us and of our call to mimic such a greeting to one another.

BUDGET 2024 UPDATE

Thank you to everyone who prayed, pledged, and participated in the 2024 Stewardship Campaign that aimed to *Join Christ on the Mountain*. With joy I can proclaim that we did join Christ on the mountain. At our February meeting, the Session approved the 2024 budget that was presented by the Finance Committee. Here are the highlights.

This year's campaign raised the largest budget in Second Presbyterian Church's history for a total of \$3,006,400. The budget includes the following breakdowns of revenues: \$2,227,500 in pledges from 408 Estimate of Giving Cards and \$470,000 in endowment distributions.

This is something to celebrate; it is also something that calls us to pay attention to the mission, ministry, and discipleship God believes we can enact in this coming year. The Session has allocated \$564,000 to Office and Property (what it takes to "run" this church and building), \$1,686,000 to Personnel (the "who" of this church), and \$560,000 to Outreach. Within these numbers, we have increases in salaries for our admins and facilities staff, new hires for communications and Children's and Family, monies to assist our staff in developing their education and ministry, and monies to be grants to our many Outreach and Mission partners and agencies. As many of us know, it is always a goal to try to give away 25% of our previous year's giving to Outreach and we've nearly accomplished that with 24.4% going to support such agencies.




The Spiritual Nourishment Class approaches wrapping up their study on Anne Lamott's *Help, Thanks, Wow.*




